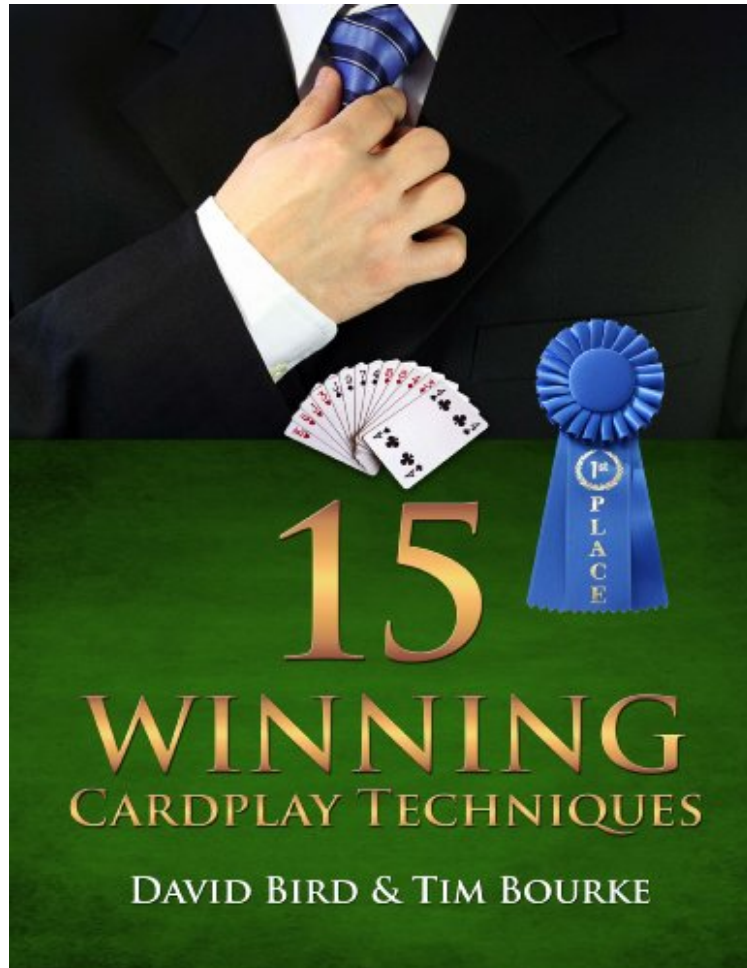

It is a mix of topics which range from the useful to the "why is there a chapter on this, no less two chapters" sort of topics chosen. As a bridge teacher, I read most English language bridge books that feature collections of hands. I brought this with me on a cruise, so I went through the whole book. I do not recommend you follow my example. A better idea is to skip the book and spend your valuable time with his recent "Clever Plays in the Trump Suit," a book that accomplishes what this book promises.
