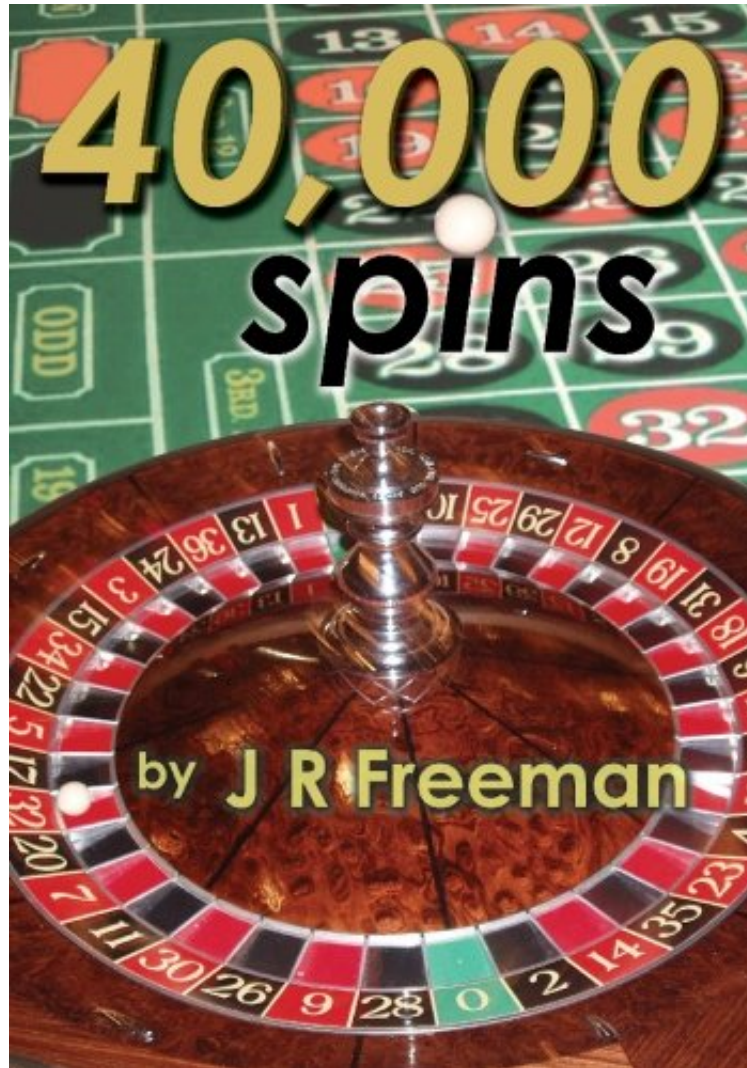

Two thousand sessions should be avoidedBy Daniel DanielsI liked this book despite the fact that I think the author grossly exaggerates his success with his betting system.The author claims to have won 81% of 2000 sessions played over a nine year period using his cluster progression roulette system.In order to see if this result could be duplicated, I wrote a C++ program to simulate 2000 sessions of play using the author's five dollar game in which the first bet of the session is five dollars and in which a session ends when the player gets \$200 ahead or falls behind \$600.I ran the program 20 times for a total of 40,000 sessions. Only 67.1% of the sessions were winning sessions. Of the 20 times the program was run for 2000 sessions, the winning percentage varied from 65.1 % to 69.1%. Not once was there a cumulative win after 2000 sessions. There was always a cumulative loss ranging from \$59,726 to \$126,157, with the average loss being \$90,985. In six of the twenty 2000 sessions there was a cumulative loss of over \$100,000. In the first chapter of the book, the author gives rules for avoiding financial problems. Based on my results, one more rule is needed: Don't play this system for 2000 sessions
