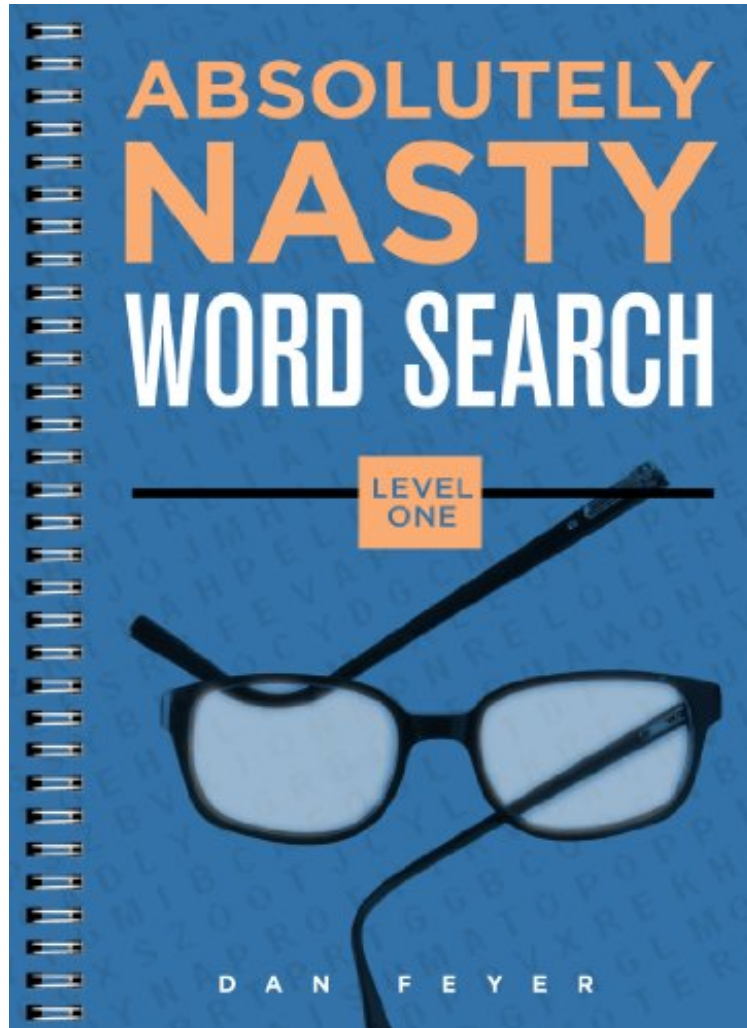

The puzzles are of varying difficulty: some actually are relatively easy. Others are daunting. I began doing Word Searches as part of my recovery from a concussion, and the 2013 series helped me to recover. The hidden messages at the end of these exercises are a reward for one's patience. There is a certain Zen quality to doing a good Word Search. I corresponded with Peter Gordon, who edits these books, complaining about some errors in the previous series (the Tasty one), and he gave me a chance to proofread this particular book last July.

I didn't have time to do so but I can say after taking over two months with the published version that the proofreading here is flawless. 0 of 0 people found the following review helpful. By DeepStar Now why am I happy for a difficult word search? In most word searches, I fly through them like the kite, which provides only a minor desire in completing more. Finally, it's a word search with higher levels of difficulty. Some are actually hard and you must take your time to complete. I left my word search at home today, but it's easily over 50 word searches. The print is medium sized. (Also don't be confused about that title: nasty is referring to challenging, not perverted. It's slang. Plus "Level one": Another bonus is that the author makes 3 other word searches, with each one going to a high level. AKA levels 1 to 4.) In most of the book's puzzles, it takes time to find all the words. The list is always a good, consistent size. Plus the searches switch their "focus", like vacation locations, words poured with Ps, mystery theme, etc. The hidden sentences/message at the end are interesting, both predictable and non. (I have to use a highlighter for the un-circled letters, otherwise I find myself missing a few letters.) Third, What a wonderful binding. It's spiral bound, with the binder covered in a realistic way. The front/back cover are contoured to leaving the pages flat, instead of holding it open. It's a lament-style, paperback cover. The paper is bright white and nice quality. You can't see the searches from the other pages!

It's the easiest level but easy is relative! Not only do the lists here include all kinds of unusual words and phrases, but sometimes they use lots of the same letters, too. And that makes it far harder to find what you're searching for.

About the Author Dan Feyer won the American Crossword Puzzle Tournament championships from 2010-2013, earning a profile in the New York Times. He authored Word Search Puzzles and It's a Wonderful Word Search for Sterling Publishing.
