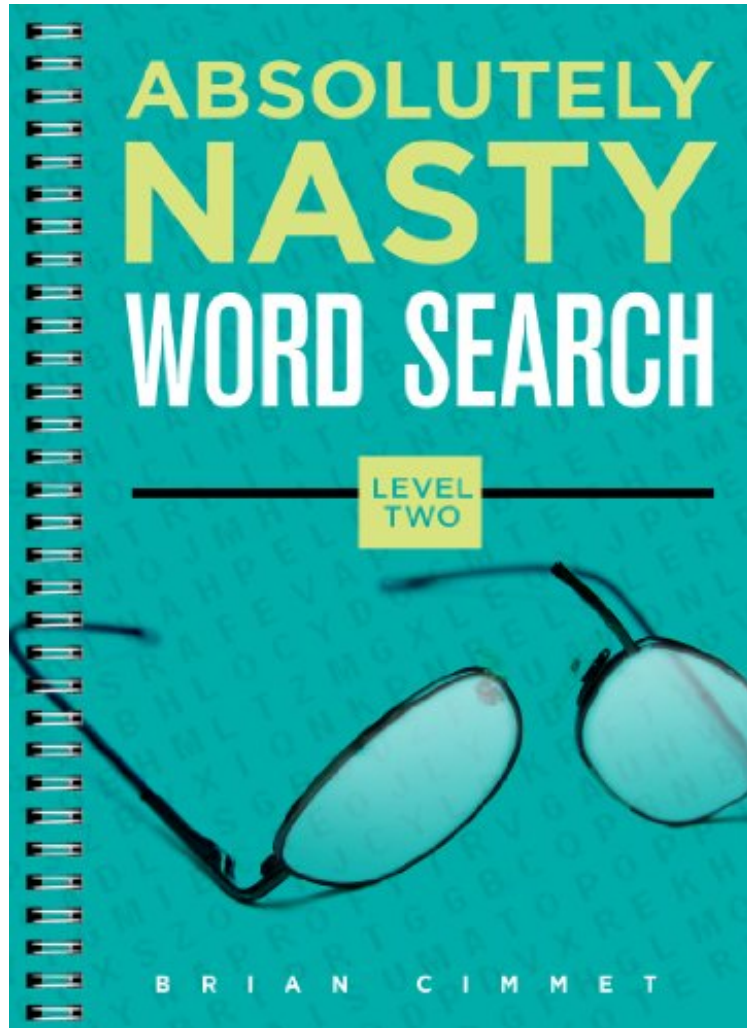

DeepStarLevel 2 has three primary word search styles. Opposites (find the opposite word in the search, quote), word bank (all words are letters from the primary WB word, no quote), and letter swap (words have one letter changed,quote), along with 2 homophones (words that sound alike, but spelled differently). I find the word banks annoying more than fun. Same letters over and over. I like the other styles better because its something different than a majority of crosswords. The print and binding is done the same as Level 1, on nice paper, good binding, well printed.

Level 2 ups the ante by turning some of the search words into anagrams, swapping letters, and featuring phrases where every answer is made up of the same handful of letters.
