Too bad that probably due to publisher's deadlines, Episode III has only a few posters included. It is understandable though as the book came out only a few months after that movie's release. Watching the evolution from hand-drawn posters to photo and computer graphics-assisted artwork while still keeping the hand drawing tradition intact is fascinating. The international posters are quite well covered, but probably they are not complete. But again, this is also understandable, and it would be nice to see another edition of this book. I also found posters dedicated to action

figures absent from this book. Other than that, it is a great, addictive read for every Star Wars fan. The weird international posters that have almost nothing to do with the movies are a riot!
