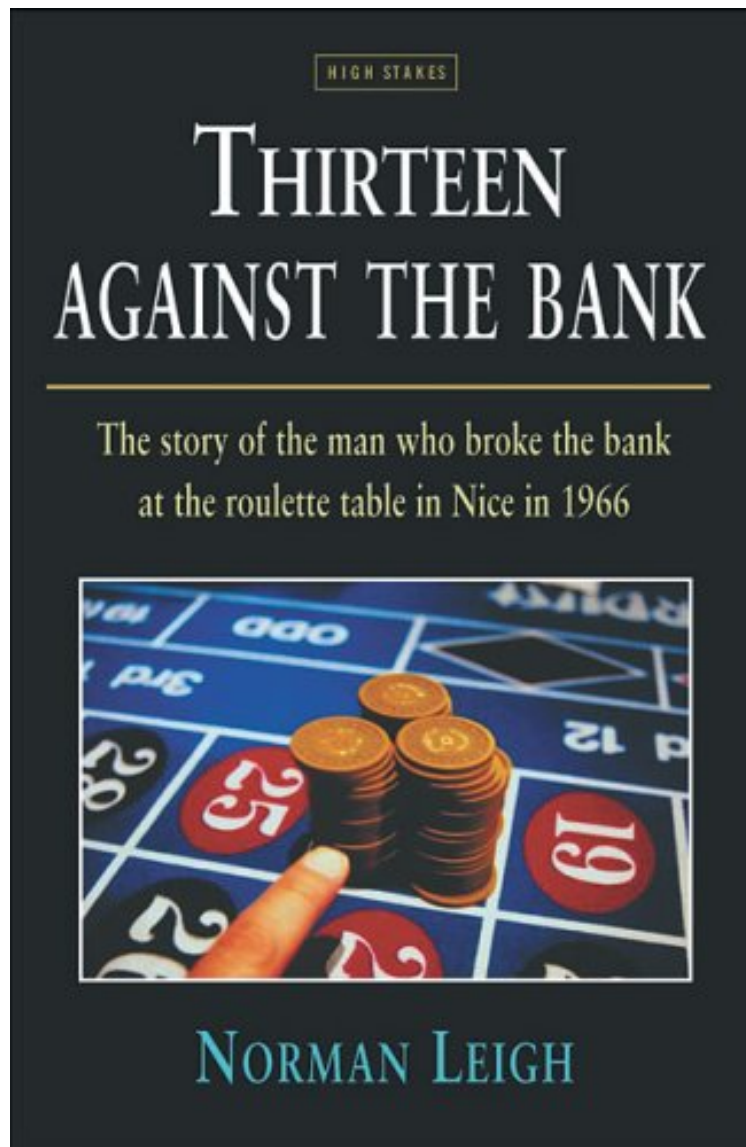

The term "system player" applies to one who uses a specific system of play rather than using the "pot luck" approach. In this case, an organized group of system players successfully "broke the bank" at a casino in France. This is an interesting, enjoyable and oftentimes fascinating read, though little here to emulate. In fact, you wouldn't be able to pull it off here because of state laws prohibiting conspiratorial acts against casinos--not to say that their system would work anyway. This is a story. Whether true or not I have no idea nor do I feel any strong inclination to do the research. However, if you are to believe the book's FOREWORD section, "This book is a true and detailed account of how a lifelong obsession led me to achieve what all expert opinion holds to be impossible--beating the table at roulette...." Actually, beating the table at roulette is not that difficult. Doing it consistently, over the long run, is the hard part. Many of us dream of being able to accomplish this thereby not having to work at a regular job. If you are interested in developing your own system for roulette I would suggest you begin with one of John Patrick's books and a gambling software program for your computer. The software program will enable you to experiment, test and practice your system before you decide to "jump in," so to speak. And, when you're ready to take that jump you should know that Atlantic City is a good place for roulette. When the table goes green you get half back on your one to one bets, except if your play is at a single "0" wheel. If you know another gambling destination (in the USA) with that policy please let me know. Thanks--and good luck. In the summer of 1966, Norman Leigh took a team to the Casino Municipale in Nice with the express intention of systematically winning large sums of money at roulette. Two weeks later, his team was banned from every casino in France not because they had cheated or behaved badly, but simply because they had won methodically and consistently. Thirteen Against the Bank is a wry and detailed account of a true event that all expert opinion deemed impossible: beating the bank at roulette. It reveals how Leigh assembled and bankrolled his crew of thirteen, instilling in them the discipline and stamina to bring off this coup and then apply it using a system known as the Reverse Labouchere betting progression.
