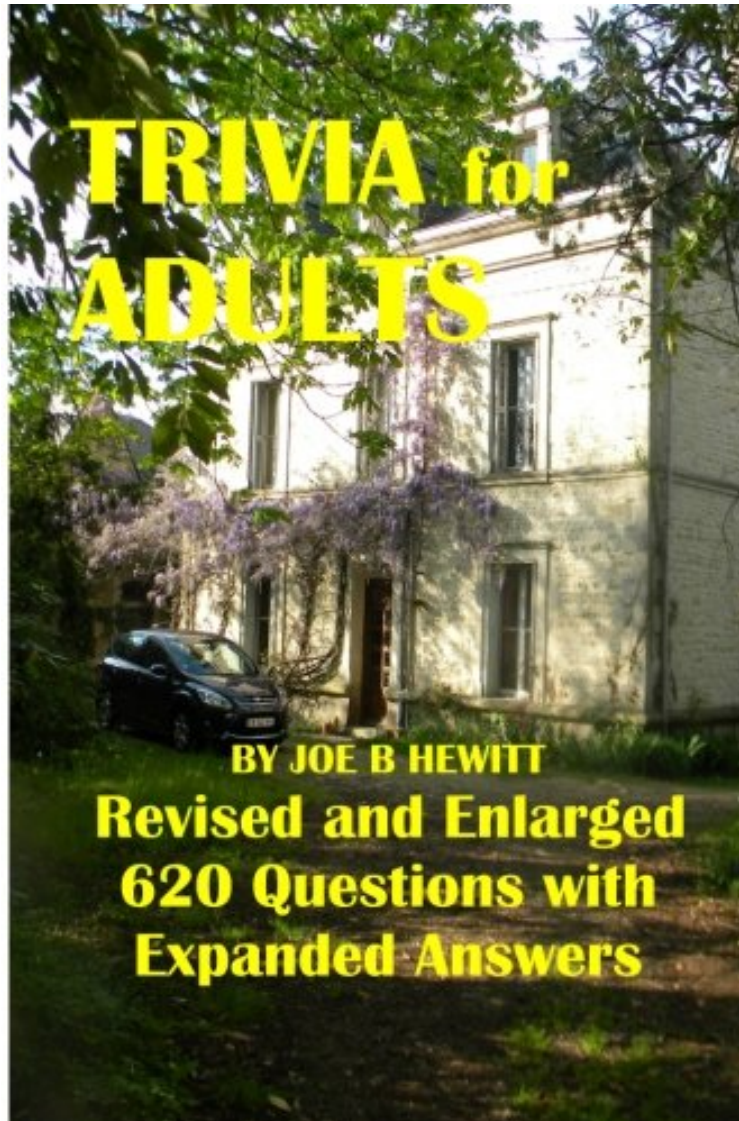

Really had potentialBy JudithI want to like this book so much because the author started out so well, but unfortunately he didn't follow through on that good beginning. This is a trivia book with a nice variety of question types. Some are quick recall questions, such as what is Harry Truman's middle name. (Trivia book authors love to try to fool you with Truman's middle name.) Other questions are more

interesting, example what percentage of heart transplant patients survive more than ten years. I liked the book's format. You are asked a group of questions. No need to write down your answers or flip back and forth between the questions and answers because the author helpfully recapped the question in the answer to jog your memory. For instance, if the question was how many months begin with a J, instead of just printing the answer as "3" he would say, "Three months begin with a J." Also, sometimes he would give you added interesting information about the answer--like saying why Truman chose S for his non-middle name. I tried the Kindle sample first, enthusiastically bought the full book, and then things started going downhill. I noticed an answer to a question I didn't remember reading. I thought it was me. Then I started noticing that answers to questions that were asked in one quiz were misplaced with answers to a different quiz. Then I came upon questions that were so oddly worded that I couldn't figure out what he was asking. Then I noticed a few questions that were repeated. Next, the recaps with the answers disappeared, and we just got unexplained answers. (Later on the recaps returned, and sometimes he even started giving citations for the answers.) The worst came when I found an inaccurate answer. He asked what was the last name of the explorer named Meriwether. He said it was Clark, but it wasn't. The book needs a good editor and proofreader to get the questions in the right order, delete the repeats, and fix that inaccurate one. It could be such a good trivia book if the author took a little time to fix it. If he's reading this review and decides to fix the problems with the book, I'd love to revise this review. By the way, if you were hoping the word "adult" in the title meant you were going to get a lot of titillating questions about sex, you'll be disappointed. So, despite all the problems, I still give this book two stars because it's priced so low, and I got enough fun out of it to get my money's worth from the book. I would even be willing to try another book by this author.

This is a book that contains instructions for playing a game of trivia with a group of adults. Other than this book and the players, the only things needed to play are paper, something to write with, and a small prize for the winners. The author includes questions that he developed himself, they have not come from some other source. There are a total of 620 questions. Since only 20 are needed per game, the book contains enough to play 31 different times.The author recommends this be played by teams as opposed to individuals. That way people can work together as a group when answering the questions. Since some of the questions are challenging, playing with others is a good idea, plus it is more fun.Trivia is defined by the Yahoo dictionary as: "miscellaneous facts, especially when the subject of questions in games and quizzes." Those are definitely the type of questions that will be found here. Lots of little known and entertaining facts pepper the pages of this book.For instance, with this volume I was truly thrilled to get the answer to why Yankee Doodle Dandy stuck a feather in his hat and called it something else (you can find out just what that was in this book). I had always wondered why he did that, now I know.Get ready for some fun!The title has been misunderstood by some to think the book's contents might be inappropriate. That is not the case, adult refers to the skill level of the questions. TRIVIA for ADULTS contains 620 original questions with EXPANDED answers. Most answers are explained, so this TRIVIA is not only entertaining but educational. None were copied from other sources. These questions are for adults.

There are no questions that only a teenager would know. Answers are separated from the questions and expanded. For example, Q621. Tishomingo is the name of a County in Mississippi and a city in Oklahoma, both named after (A. A Confederate hero of the Civil War. (B. An early Spanish Explorer. C. A Chickasha Indian Chief. A621. Tishomingo County in Mississippi and Tishomingo, Oklahoma, are named after (C. A Chickasha Indian Chief who led his people west during the Trail of Tears when they were forced out of their homes and lands in Alabama and Mississippi. Tishomingo, Oklahoma, is the capital of the Chickasha Nation. TRIVIA for ADULTS is to furnish educated, thinking people some brain exercise. There is no board, tokens, or dice to roll, just questions and answers. One person has to be in charge, to read the questions and help grade the teams. Players form teams, quietly discuss the question among themselves and come up with a consensus answer. If you follow my instructions on how to put the teams together, TRIVIA for ADULTS will serve as a catalyst to get people better acquainted with each other. Rules are explained first, then the questions and answers, after that, a sample score sheet that you can duplicate and use.

About the Author Joe B. Hewitt, author of TRIVIA for ADULTS, has "been there; done that." He has visited Mexico, Costa Rica, Panama, Colombia, Brazil, most of the islands in the Caribbean, Spain, France, Italy, Greece, Turkey, Lebanon, Syria, Israel, and Russia, and has traveled extensively in Mexico, Canada, and Britain, and all 50 of the United States.
